## SCHEDULE

**ALL THAT** land the property of Archibald Connolly situate at Vauxhall in the parish of Christ Church in this Island containing by admeasurement 11,165.7 square metres (inclusive of 283.1 square metres in road) or thereabouts abutting and bounding on a road, on lands now or late of Josephine Yarde on lands now or formerly of Evelyn Concrete Works on lands now or formerly of the Barbados Government, on lands now or late of Odessa Applewaite on other lands now or formerly of the Barbados Government on lands now or late of Robert Burrowes on lands now or late of Clayton Pitt and on lands now or late of Duncan Carter or however else the same may abut and bound as shown and delineated on a plan certified on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of April, 2010 by Kevin R. Belgrave and Andre P.G. Clarke, Land Surveyors and recorded in the Lands and Surveys Department on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of May, 2010 as Plan No. 652/2010.

## ADDENDUM

On the 1<sup>st</sup> day of October, 2009, the Cabinet agreed that the parcel of land situate at Vauxhall in the parish of Christ Church, more particularly describe in the Schedule to this Resolution, should be acquired for the public purpose of housing development.
