RESOLVED that Parliament in accordance with section 5 of the *Crown Lands (Vesting and Disposal) Act*, Cap. 225, approve the vesting in the National Housing Corporation of the parcel of land, the property of the Crown, situate at 1st Avenue Long Gap, in the parish of Saint Michael, in this Island and more particularly described in the *Schedule* to this Resolution for disposal by way of sale for residential purposes.

SCHEDULE

ALL THAT land situate at 1st Avenue, Long Gap, in the parish of Saint Michael, in this Island, containing by admeasurement 496.9 square metres or thereabouts Abutting and Bounding on lands now or late of Volita Holder and on lands now or late of Veina Carrington and on lands now or late of the Barbados Government and lands now or late of Johanna Corbin and on lands now or late of Ruby King and a public road known as 1st Avenue Long Gap or however else the same may abut and bound as shown and delineated on a plan certified on the 12th day of March, 2004 by Nigel S.A. Lucas, Land Surveyor and recorded in the Lands and Surveys Department on the 18th day of March, 2004, as Plan No. 293/2004 together with the building thereon.

ADDENDUM

The Cabinet agreed on the 8th day of June, 2006, to the vesting of 496 square meters of Crown land at 1st Avenue Long Gap, in the parish of Saint Michael in the National Housing Corporation for disposal by way of sale to a Mr. Winston Forde.

The Crown acquired a parcel of land formerly known as "Woodstock" on the 28th February, 1978 for the resiting of the primary school known as Lawrence T. Gay Primary School.

In relation to the said parcel of land, 496.9 square metres of that parcel of land is now considered to be an excess of land falling outside of the school fence and between other residential properties to the west of the school.

The Chief Town Planner and the Ministry of Housing and Lands confirmed that there were no restrictions limiting the lands for disposal by way of sale now proposed.

In accordance with the provisions of section 5 of the *Crown Lands (Vesting and Disposal) Act*, Cap. 225, the approval of Parliament is now sought for the vesting in the National Housing Corporation of the land described in the *Schedule* to this Resolution.
