

## OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill would provide for the grant of a sum of money out of the Consolidated Fund and the appropriation of the same for the service of Barbados for the Year ending 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2011.

**2.** The Accountant General may, on the warrant of the Minister responsible for Finance or a person authorised by the Minister in writing, issue out of the Consolidated Fund and apply towards making good the supply granted for the service of the year ending the 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2011 a sum not exceeding in the aggregate \$1,833,161,117.

**3.** The sum referred to in section 2 is hereby appropriated for the services and purposes set out in the *Schedule* in accordance with section 109(1) of the *Constitution* and shall be so appropriated from 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2010.
