**TOURISM DEVELOPMENT (SUNSET VIEWS VILLA) NOTICE, 2026**

The Minister, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 5 of the *Tourism Development Act*, gives the following Notice:

1. This Notice may be cited as the *Tourism Development (Sunset Views Villa) Notice, 2026*.
2. Interim approval has been granted, with the approval of the Cabinet, to the applicant, Podiatry International Corporation, in respect of a tourism project for the construction of a vacation rental property to be known as “Sunset Views Villa” situate at Lot 29, Sunset Views, Dunscombe in the parish of Saint Thomas.

**TRAFFIC CONTROL (CROP OVER CEREMONIAL DELIVERY OF  
THE LAST CANES) RULES, 2026**

The Commissioner of Police, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Crop Over Ceremonial Delivery of the Last Canes) Rules, 2026*.

2. In these Rules,

“alternative emergency route” means a route which is an alternative to the emergency route and commences at Queen’s Park and proceeds along Constitution Road, John Beckles Drive, River Road, and Martindale’s Road in the parish of Saint Michael;

“emergency route” means a route which commences at Queen’s Park and proceeds along Constitution Road, Mencea Cox Round-a-bout and Martindale’s Road in the parish of Saint Michael;

“emergency vehicle” means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross Society;
- (b) the Department of Emergency Management; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

“Festival Committee” means the Crop Over Festival Committee in the Division of Culture in the Prime Minister’s Office;

“relevant date” means Saturday, 4<sup>th</sup> July, 2026;

“relevant period” means from 12:00 hours to 23:00 hours;

“route” means Saint Michael Row, Constitution Road and Queen’s Park in the parish of Saint Michael;

“vehicle” has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act*, Cap. 295.

**3.** On the relevant date, from 15:00 hours to 16:00 hours, the Crop Over Ceremonial Delivery of the Last Canes Parade will take place commencing from Church Village Greens proceeding along the route and finishing at Queen’s Park in the parish of Saint Michael.

**4.** On the relevant date, from 14:00 hours to 16:00 hours, the route shall be closed to all vehicular traffic except those vehicles driven by persons participating in the Parade and those vehicles used by the Festival Committee.

**5.** On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall drive along, park or allow the vehicle to remain stationary on any of the following roads except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers:

- (a) Saint Michael Row;
- (b) Crumpton Street;
- (c) Constitution Road;
- (d) Nursery Drive Road; and
- (e) John Beckles Drive,

in the parish of Saint Michael.

**6.** On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary along the

emergency route or the alternative emergency route except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers.

7. All drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any road specified in rules 4 and 5 shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Barbados Police Service in uniform.

8. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Barbados Police Service in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months or to both.

9. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Barbados Police Service, the Barbados Defence Force or the Barbados Fire Service or any emergency vehicle.
