ORDER NO. 8

BARBADOS TOURIST PRODUCT AUTHORITY (REPEAL) (TRANSFER OF ASSETS AND LIABILITIES) BILL, 2025

On the motion being called, Senator the Hon. Ms. L. R. Cummins spoke and moved that the Bill be referred to the Joint Select Committee (Standing) on the Economic and Productive Sectors.

ORDER NO. 4**RESOLUTION THAT THE PARLIAMENT OF BARBADOS TAKES NOTE
OF THE 2023-2028 NATIONAL POLICY ON AGEING**

Senator the Hon. Ms. L. R. Cummins spoke on the following Resolution:

WHEREAS the Government has signaled its intention to promote healthy and active ageing for the elderly and to ensure that they live with dignity in their remaining years having made a significant contribution to the development of the country;

AND WHEREAS the Government of Barbados is cognizant that Barbados is now an aged society;

AND WHEREAS the Government of Barbados recognizes that by 2050 one in every five persons will be over the age of 65;

AND WHEREAS it is recognized that there is abuse of the elderly in various ways including financial abuse;

AND WHEREAS the policy recognizes the significant role that the elderly can continue to play in national development if they are given more opportunities to contribute in various ways according to their abilities as the Government seeks to expand the silver economy;

AND WHEREAS the Government has engaged in extensive consultations with stakeholders within the social policy space on the National Policy on Ageing;

AND WHEREAS the Cabinet has approved the National Policy on Ageing;

AND WHEREAS the Policy has been laid in Parliament to foster parliamentary debate on this document;

AND WHEREAS the policy recognizes eight thematic areas which are fundamental to promoting healthy and active ageing and protecting the rights of the elderly and preventing their abuse, namely:

- i) Financial and economic security;
- ii) Social security;
- iii) Health and health systems;
- iv) Physical and built environment;
- v) Social environment;
- vi) Legislation;
- vii) Long term care; and
- viii) Pandemics, disasters and emergency situations.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Parliament of Barbados take note of the 2023-2028 National Policy on Ageing.

APPROVED by the House of Assembly the 17th day of September 2024.

and moved that the Resolution be approved and that further consideration of the Resolution be deferred to a date to be stated.

AND WHEREAS it is in the public interest that a fuller discourse on these Bills be undertaken;

BE IT RESOLVED that subject to the concurrence of the Honourable the House of Assembly the Tourist Accommodation Bill, 2025 and the Barbados Tourism Product Authority (Repeal) (Transfer of Assets and Liabilities) Bill, 2025 be referred to the Joint Select Committee (Standing) on Economic and Productive Sectors;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Committee be empowered consider the merits and principles of the Bills and report three (3) months from reference.
