3. MAJOR RECOMMENDATIONS OUT OF MEETINGS

Recommendations were that :-

- 3.1 The secretary\treasurer be asked to inform the Ministry of Education, Science, Technology & Innovation that the Board was unable to achieve the 10% reduction in Other Personal Emoluments unless there was a reduction in staff.
- 3.2 Miss Makeba WOOD act as teacher vice Mr. Nathan Hart on secondment to the Barbados Water Authority 1st September 2013 31st August 2014.
- 3.3 Mr. Kemar TROTMAN be assigned as part-time teacher 1st September 2013 31st August 2014 to cover Mrs. Tonesha Graham's extra teaching periods. Mrs. Graham was recommended to over-see duties of information technology co-ordinator.
- 3.4 Mrs. Richell HUSBANDS be given a temporary appointment as Graduate Teacher for the period 1st January - 31st August 2014, Mr. Carmichael Springer retired.
- 3.5 Miss Nya GREENIDGE be permanenly appointed with effect from 1st September 2013 to the post vacated by Miss Denise Weekes.

- 3.6 The Principal's request of the Deputy Chief Education Officer, Ministry of Education, Science, Technology & Innovation for permission to recruit a part-time teacher to teach the twelve (12) periods of Agricultural Science (practical) allocated to Mrs. Marcelle Catling. Mr. Paul LUCAS was recruited for the period 11th May 31st August 2013.

occurred in September 2008 on the transfer on promotion of Miss Beverly Bancroft to the post of Deputy Principal at Springer Memorial School. With the submission of the recommendation for Miss Greenidge, there would be one other vacant post. The secretary\treasurer was instructed to commence advertisement for that post. It was noted that there was a requirement for a more detailed advertisement. In the absence of funds for advertising the vacancy would be published within the Public Service in accordance with Section 2 of the First Schedule of the Recruitment and Employment Code of the Public Service Act 2007-41.

- 3.17 That Mr. Ryan BURKE, Head of Department, Business\Computer Studies, be granted a leave of absence without pay for the period 1st September 2014 31st August 2015 to join his wife in Bermuda.
- 3.18 As a consequence of the on-going renovations, it is was noted that Block "K" would not be completed before September 2014. The canteen concession was due for renewal at the end of the two (2) year contract. If the concession was awarded to a new proprietor there may be problems of mobilisation for the start of the new school year. Therefore, a recommendation was made to the Ministry of Education, Science, Technology & Innovation to have the advertisement deferred for one year.
- 3.19 Mr. Cleverson HUSBANDS be offered a temporary post as General Worker (Labourer) with effect from 1st August 2014 to replace Mr. Olvis Knight.
- 3.20 Mr. Corey GRANT be offered a temporary post as General Worker (Labourer) with effect from 1st September 2014 in the post which became vacant on the retirement of Mr. George Brathwaite.
- 3.21 Mr. Lennox HAZELL be offered the post of the newly created post of Security Guard, with effect from 1st September 2014.
- 3.22 Mr. Matthew BOLDEN be offered the post of Relief Watchman I with effect from 1st August 2014.
- 3.23 Mr. Charles VANDERPOOL and Mr. Kemar TROTMAN be permanently appointed. Given that there was only one available vacancy it was agreed that Mr. Vanderpool, as the longer servicing officer, be appointed with effect from 1st September 2014 which would become vacant on the retirement of Mr. Grafton Cobham. Mr. Trotman (who had been previously assigned as part-time teacher) would be placed in a temporary vacancy until such time as an established post became vacant.
- 3.24 With the re-assignment of Mr. Trotman to a full-time post the part-time post will be vacant. The Board of Management recommended that Miss Nickel PEMBLETON be offered this post.

- 5.1 The Board continued to ensure sound financial management of the approved funds.
- 5.2 During the period a request was made for permission to employ substitutes for the Board's office. However, this was not granted and it was necessary for the secretary\treasurer to visit the school periodically in order to make approvals on the SmartStream accounting system.
- 5.3 It was also quite difficult to make payments in a timely manner because of a lack of specific guidance in relation to the "below the line" accounts. The Board would be grateful for specific written directions regarding expenditures allowed under the various headings.
- 5.4 VAT refunds were received for October 2010, July, October and November 2012, January and March 2013.
- Again preparation of the 2013-2014 Audit was delayed by the need to restate the reports prepared by the SmartStream Accounting System into a format acceptable to the Auditor. The use of one bank account and reports that do not distinguish payments for the Grant from the "Below the Line" accounts are the cause of this problem.

7.2.2 No meeting was held to discuss the results.

7.3 Internal Examinations 2013

7.3.1 The overall pass rate in the internal examinations was 89%, the aim was to improve this to 95% in 2014. Continuous assessment was the method used to determine promotion.

7.4 Extra Mural Competitions/Sports and Games

- 7.4.1 Anderson Devonish was awarded an athletic scholarship to Illinois State University. He was also a member of the Barbados team to the Junior Pan Am games which were held in Colombia.
- 7.4.2 The Lodge School won its eleventh consecutive United Insurance Inter-School Chess Championship.
- 7.4.3 Candidate Master Orlando Husbands is a double CAC gold medallist and the only one in the history of Barbados and the only school boy to achieve the title of Candidate Master. He also won the Barbados National Chess Championship.
- 7.4.4 The Sagicor Open Junior Chess Championship, Yu Tein Poon and Orlando Husbands tied for the gold medal in the under 20 division.
- 7.4.5 Jarion Hoyte was a member of the Dover Sports Club tour to England. He was also a member of the Barbados Under 15 team to Jamaica where he was the leading fielder in the tournament.

7.4.6 The under 19 Netball team finished third in the just concluded schools' tournament.

7.5 PTA Activities

7.6 School sports

- 7.6.1 The "Sir Keith Hunte" sports day was held on Friday, 7th February 2014 and due to the inclemency of the weather, it was completed on Wednesday, 12th February 2014. Sir Keith offered his services to the school in any appropriate area.
- 7.6.2 Codrington House was the winner of the intra-school sports.

7.7 Inter-Schools' Sports

The finals of the inter-schools' championships were held on 27th and 28th March 2014 at the National Stadium.

7.8 Overseas Tours

The Language Department conducted a tour to Margarita for students of Spanish in 2014.

7.9 Staffing

- 7.9.1 Mrs. Marcelle Catling, who was transferred from the Alexandra School in January 2013, assumed duties on 1st September 2013. The Head of Department was pleased with her contribution. She also proved to be an effective Senior Teacher and taught the Agricultural Science theory. Mr. Romel McDonald and Mr. Dwayne Hoyte (Laboratory Technician) were assisting with the practical component. Mrs. Catling had oversight of Agricultural Science and assisted wherever she could.
- 7.9.2 The Principal expressed concern that Mr. Curtis Toppin (Porter) had reported sick with diarrhoea on Tuesday, February 25th 2014 and several other days from the start of the year. Mr. Anthony Holder, the other Porter had also reported sick on 25th February 2014. The two porters seemed often to be sick or late on the same day. This caused problems with the opening of classrooms at the start of the school day. The Principal reported several other problems with the service of Mr. Toppin. He noted that during the working day it was often difficult to find Mr. Toppin to carry out assignments. The Chairman asked the secretary\treasurer why she had not documented these infractions. She reminded him that she had made verbal and written reports. The matter of Mr. Toppin's availability during the day was particularly problematic since Mr. Holder was taking up the slack of driving duties while Mr. Harris was on sick leave. The secretary\treasurer was asked to convene a meeting of the Appointments & Disciplinary Committee with Messrs. Toppin and Holder.
- 7.9.3 The Principal said that there were problems in the Industrial Arts, English and Mathematics Departments. He said all three (3) heads were having problems with leadership.

7.10 Graduation\Speech Day

- 7.10.1 The sixth form graduation was scheduled for 28th June 2014 at the Lloyd Erskine Sandiford Centre.
- 7.10.2 The fifth form salute "Lodge Salute" was scheduled for 26th June 2014 at the Accra Beach Hotel & Resort.
- 7.10.3 The speech day and prize giving ceremony was held on Wednesday, 2nd April 2014 on the hard courts. Mr. Aidan Rogers delivered the main address.

7.13 Activities

- 7.13.1 Michaela Rock, a Lower Sixth form student, attended The Global Young Leaders Conference which was held in Beijing, China.
- 7.13.2 The Lodge School participated in three (3) categories at National Independence Festival of Creative Arts (NIFCA) and performed very well.
- 7.13.4 In the Performing Arts Section, the school entered two individual performers and one group piece called "Dying, but fighting back." The group piece was awarded a bronze medal and the Barbados Manufacturers Award. In the Visual Arts Section, the school entered 14 pieces and we were awarded 1 gold medal, 2 silver medals and 7 bronze medals. In the Culinary Arts Section we were awarded 1 gold medal, 2 silver medals, and 14 bronze medals.

7.14 Health & Safety

7.14.1 Christopher Best of form 1:5 sustained an injury to his eye as result of a pen being thrown by Shamar Barker. The matter was settled between the parents.

8. PLANT AND FACILITIES

8.1 There was some delay in the handing over of Block C. Work on Block K commenced in October 2013 because of the delay in the handing over of Blocks B and H. Work also commenced on the new pavilion, which would be situated to the south of the old pavilion. The old pavilion would undergo minor renovations on completion of the new one. It was expected that the work would be completed by September 2014. The time frame for Block H might be impacted by constraints of noise abatement, if the members of the Barbados Secondary Teachers' Union were not comfortable.

- 8.2 The acquisition of the land for the new auditorium remained outstanding, it wou seem that the Cabinet, suggested that an adjacent piece of land should a' be acquired. It was, therefore, necessary to recommence the process. ne acquisition of the land at Guinea Plantation changed the layout of the school.
- 8.3 The School was closed on Friday 20th September 2013 to allow the contractors to pave the yard. It was also closed on Friday 1st November 2013 to allow the staff to be relocated to their new staff room in Block B. The principal's offices were also moved on that day to Block H. The building of the new pavilion and the refurbishment of Block K have already begun. This is phase three of the project and it was scheduled to be completed by September 2014. The negotiations for the purchase of the land, on which the new hall is to be built, should be completed by January 2014 at which time construction would commence.
- 8.4 A meeting which was held on 6th February 2014 to discuss concerns raised by the Barbados Secondary Teachers' Union about the noise and dust from the work on Block K which was impacting on persons using Block I.

An agreement was reached to relocate six classroom (three on the first floor and three on the ground floor). The screening of Block I involved week-end work.

The floor above the canteen was poured on Friday 21st February 2014. An arrangement was made with the Ministry of Education to close the school should the noise become unbearable. The pouring started at 12.00pm and the noise was bearable. Work on the pavilion commenced in September 2013.

9. **CONCLUSION**

- 9.1 The Board received approval of its recommendations for the permanent appointment of eleven (11) persons.
- 9.2 A major problem involved absenteeism and lateness of teachers. A case in point, Miss Mary-Ann Redman had not taught a full week for the school year. The Principal could identify those teachers who were punctual, but could not implement a system to record the late comers. This was principally because of the fact that in schools where the Barbados Secondary Teachers' Union operated there was a great resistance to having teachers sign in. Originally, the resistance was used to maintain the status quo for the teachers covered by the Memorandum of Understanding. However, the new entrants to the service were being groomed to resist this statutory requirement. Absenteeism and lateness caused considerable problems at morning assembly as many students were unsupervised. The Principal said that senior prefects were not accorded the level of respect as in previous years and only a few of them were able to effectively assist in this area.
- 9.3 The Board of Management was of the opinion that terms and conditions for nonteaching staff should be examined with a view to improvement.

A Health & Safety Committee was in place, but the Chairman was of the opinion that there was a need to revisit the matter of the Safety & Health at Work Act 2005-12 as it related to The Lodge School.
