## **Recommendation for Senior Teacher**

A recommendation by the Board of Management for the permanent assignment as Senior Teacher of Mr. Winston Cumberbatch had to be rescinded after it was pointed

out by the Ministry of Education that Dr. Victor Agard had acted in the assignment for over ten years without any adverse reports. The Board's recommendation was also questioned by the Teachers' Union. A recommendation was subsequently submitted for the permanent assignment of Dr. Agard as Senior Teacher.

## Retirement

Mr. Keith Greene, Qualified Teacher retired from the Service with effect from 01 January, 2009.

## SCHOOL PLANT AND FACILITIES

The Principal was concerned over the slow pace at which work had been done on the school since his appointment. These concerns were made known to Mr. Richard Harrison of the EPIU both verbally and written. He outlined areas of major concern as: a) the unfinished state of the hall – acoustics and ventilation; b) the state of the playing field – needs grading, additional pitch, open holes to be filled.

### **Boundary Wall**

During the period under review the Perimeter wall fell and officials from the Richmond Depot of the Ministry of Transport & Works had cleared the area and erected a temporary fence. The Ministry of Housing had been notified of the situation and an estimate for cost of replacing the wall had been forwarded to that Ministry for insurance purposes.

## Illegal Vending

The number of itinerant vendors on the peripherals of the compound was excessive. Police had been summoned to address the problem, however, students complained regarding the prices of the canteen's lunches.

## **Room for Guidance Counselor**

The present Guidance Counselor's room was partitioned in order to provide accommodation for the other Counselor. The costing for this venture had been prepared by the Industrial Arts Department and the work was done by a teacher from the said department.

### Sick Bay

A room originally prepared as a sick bay was reconfigured to better serve the purpose for which it had been prepared.

## **Enclosure of the Auditorium**

The open foyer of the auditorium was enclosed with iron bars and rails to allow for greater security of the area. The overall cost was twenty-eight thousand dollars (\$28,000).

## Partitioning of the basement of the auditorium

The basement of the auditorium was partitioned to include a school gymnasium, General Studies room, Business Studies room and Mathematics room. An area for a thrift shop is also being prepared. The work was done by the Artisan.

## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### Roll

At the beginning of the school year there were 36 forms comprising 1017 students.

## **School Projects**

The Principal reported on projects to be implemented throughout the school as follows:

- A five-year developmental plan was being formulated
- An area had been identified to be used as a barber shop door and windows were to be installed.
- The school would again enter the Junior Dualling Chef Competition.
- Plans were being formulated for a Science exhibition. The Ministry of the Environment had offered assistance to Schools with such projects.

### **UNICEF Project**

A project entitled "Change from within" was being organized by UNICEF. Dr. Kerri King of that organization visited the school and had prepared a schedule for the project which was scheduled to begin on January 15<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Achievements**

The school's one-hundred strong choir had won the Mall Internationale competition for schools and had been awarded a prize of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1500.00)

The schools' football team had won the Football Cup.

The Cricket team shared the Cricket Championships with Alexandra.

### **SUMMER CAMPS**

The summer camps ran by the Ministry of Family Affairs and supervised by the Honorable Hamilton Lashley MP, needed better supervision. There were reports of immature counselors cursing and smoking on the school's compound as well as of untidy boys, inappropriately dressed, being encouraged to be among our young charges. In addition, there were damages to the school plant by the young participants. Toilet doors were vandalized and bowls were broken. There is also a damaged door in the pavilion with a broken lock. Copies of invoices for repairs to the school plant were sent to the Ministry of Family Affairs.

#### **FINANCE**

#### Presentation of Estimates

The Board noted that funds allocated by the Ministry of Education for the year under review were utilized in the various item heads as indicated in the approved Estimates.

The Board also noted the introduction of the preparation of the Estimates of Expenditure for three-year periods to be adjusted for each year.

### Conclusion

The Board noted that during its first year of existence, it was able to address some pressing concerns which were critical to the school's prudent management. These include Illegal vending, the canteen concessionaire and disruptive students.

It was also able, along with the administrative unit, to ensure that careful and skillful financial presence was maintained at all times and professional and cordial relationships existed between the Board and the staff. This has ensured that the school has remained focused, both academically and through the development of its social programmes.
